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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

HEALTH CARE AUXILIARY OF MINNESOTA

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the corporation shall be the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota.

ARTICLE II REGISTERED OFFICE

The registered office of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall be in Hennepin County at 2221 University Avenue SE, Suite 425, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55414.

ARTICLE III ORGANIZATION

The Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota is organized under Minnesota Statute Chapter 317A.

ARTICLE IV PURPOSE

The Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall be a not for profit, charitable organization dedicated to the following purposes:

1. To educate, support and vitalize the members of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota.
2. To encourage contributions which individual auxilians can make in activities directed towards improved health care service.
3. To inform its members of state and national trends and legislation concerning health and welfare.

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4. To engage in other lawful, charitable and philanthropic activities within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, that support and encourage the activities and goals of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota.

To this end, the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall at all times be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended. All funds, whether income or principal, and whether acquired by gift or contribution or otherwise, shall be devoted to said purposes.

ARTICLE V I.R.S. EXEMPTION REQUIREMENTS

At all times shall the following operate as conditions restricting the operations and activities of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota:

1. No part of the net earnings of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall inure to any member of the corporation not qualifying as exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, nor to any director or officer of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota, nor to any other private person, excepting such reasonable compensation that the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall pay for services actually rendered to the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota, or allowed by the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota as a reasonable allowance for authorized expenditures incurred on behalf of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota;
2. No substantial part of the activities of the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall constitute the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, or any initiative or referendum before the public, and the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office, including by publication or distribution of statements;
3. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Health Care Auxiliary of Minnesota shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended.

INCORPORATORS**

We, the undersigned incorporators certify that we are authorized to execute these articles of incorporation and further certify that we understand that by signing these articles, we are subject to the penalties of perjury as set forth in section 609.48 as if we had signed these articles under oath.


