

# MAHV-elous Awards for Outstanding Volunteers, 2022

## **District A**

## **CHI St Joseph's Health (Park Rapids)**

<u>Carol Smith</u>: To aid a staffing transition in the Gift Shop, Carol has gone 'above and beyond' to assist whenever and wherever she sees a need. For example, she picked up an order of merchandise from Apple Valley to save shipping costs and delivered the order to the gift shop right away. Carol watches the Gift Shop calendar to ensure that someone is working or picks up the shift herself - she is keeping the doors open! This really helps the new Gift Shop Coordinator, who does not yet know all the people and when they are available to fill shifts. Carol also communicates if there is an incident or event (e.g., illness, family emergency) that may affect one of the volunteers, so that the volunteer coordinator knows about
